- 4. All entries must be clearly marked with an appropriate entry tag furnished by the Franklin County Fair showing name, exhibitor number, department, class, and age classification. Tags may be picked up at the fair when bringing entries in.
- 5. Exhibits must be entered on MONDAY from 4:00-7:00 p.m. or TUESDAY from 7:30 -11:00 a.m. Floriculture and Horticulture are entered on THURSDAY from 7:30 11:00 a.m. NO LATE ENTRIES ACCEPTED.
- 6. Judging (except Floriculture and Horticulture) begins on Tuesday at 1:00 p.m. Floriculture and Horticulture judging begins Thursday at 1:00 p.m.
- 7. The Franklin County Fair Association is not responsible for damage or loss to any entry.
- 8. Exhibits must be removed from 5:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. Sunday. All exhibitors will receive recognition in print. Any exhibits not removed will be held in the fair office until Friday, July 26. OFFICE CLOSES AT NOON. After this date, unclaimed exhibits will be disposed of.
- 9. No restriction on number of blue, red or white ribbons in any department. One purple ribbon per age group, per department will be awarded. Exhibit will be judged on its own merit. Judge's decision is final.
- 10. All entries need to be grown by and/or designed and constructed by entrant as each class and lot dictated in rules. This includes ALL age groups.
- 11. Exhibits must not have been entered in a previous Franklin County Fair.
- 12. A place will be provided for exhibitors to watch and listen during judging. No one will be allowed communication with the judge during judging. A conference with the judge is permitted after all judging in the department is done. Anyone . interfering with above rules forfeits all premiums
